Quick update: Tomasz's story checks out so far. There is indeed a PCC case (against HuffPo) although it was resolved without the need for adjudication when they printed a correction (specifically blaming CEN):

"In an article headlined 'Drunk Santa & Helper Flung From Sleigh Face Drink Driving Charges' provided to use by the Central European News Agency (CEN), a passer-by Zdzislaw Molodynski was quoted as saying Santa and his helper were drunk. Mr Molodynski has since informed us that he did not make these comments, and we have removed the article and apologise for the inaccuracy. We are also happy to make clear that Santa and his helper did not face any charges."

Interestingly HuffPo have now completely deep sixed the article – there's nothing at all at the URL , and it's even scrubbed from the Wayback Machine. There are still tweets however (screenshot attached). Mail have also deleted their article , but it does still exist on the Wayback Machine (screenshot also attached).

I am writing to you on the matter of Central European News agency. I am a freelance Polish journalist and I happened to be involved with the story published by Daily Mail and British clone of Huffington Post in which the unfortunate accident with a Santa's sledge that happened in Poland was portrayed as a drink-driving incident. CEN achieved their aim by putting words into the mouth of two witnesses and inventing third one.

I happened to speak with one of those witnessed and ms Martyna Sokolowska from a local internet portal in the area spoke with other one. They both deny ever speaking the words. We both failed to find the third witness, that was supposed to be yet another local person, but nobody ever heard about her, and this is really small village.

The story run by CEN had a huge impact on the life of one of the witnesses, as when the story broke in British media, he was accused by the local community of lying and smearing the victims in order to make money on his story. He was even about to be sued, he was hounded by the whole community (it is a really small place) and he was even thinking about taking his life... I agreed to represent him in Press Complain Commision, as he does not speak any English, and I won, Daily Mail and HuffPost were forced to publish clarification. As you can guess, it's simply pyrric victory.

Therefore I would like to offer that if you even will be sued by CEN, I am happy to testify as a witness, and I can put you in touch with mr Mołodyński, who was a victim of the CEN actions, and with ms Sokolowska, who was following the story locally.

I am glad to see that you are taking them head on, and I am supporting you in every way.
